

We have been extremely fortunate in securing as this year's Paterson Memorial Lecturer the newly appointed director of the Victoria and Albert Museum, Tristram Hunt. This January, he resigned from a distinguished Parliamentary career, having served as the Labour Party's Shadow Secretary of State for Education, to take up this important post.

*From 2001 to 2010, Tristram combined being a Senior Lecturer in History at Queen Mary, University of London, with presenting a range of radio and television programmes for the BBC and Channel 4. His published works include books on the English Civil War, the rise and fall of the Victorian city, the life of Friedrich Engels and, most recently, Ten Cities That Made an Empire.*

*A Trustee of the National Heritage Memorial Fund and the Heritage Lottery Fund, he played a key role in saving the Wedgwood Collection. He is a Fellow of the Royal Historical Society and a member of the Council of the Royal College of Art.*

As an enthusiastic campaigner for arts education, he is an admirable choice to head the world's leading decorative arts and design museum at a time when all museums are facing an uncertain future.
